Skillfully interspersed with Linda Arden's commentary about the events and situations of the era, these letters are a time capsule of the mid-nineteenth century. In many respects, Foster's letters mirror the comments made by soldiers on both sides: their efforts to seek comfort with news from home, their litany of complaints about the rigors of camp and battle, and their descriptions of men and events on the front lines. However, there is another dimension to Foster's letters that is much less common in Civil War correspondence; the intimate exchange of the couple's views on sex.

**PITTSBURGH DURING THE AMERICAN CIVIL WAR 1860-1865**, by Arthur B. Fox. The first book of its kind to explore this turbulent period as it directly affected this area, this reveals previously unrecorded facets about Pittsburgh's role during the conflict, and never-before published photographs and plans. Pittsburgh and Allegheny County contributed not only 25,000 troops, but a massive outpouring of military equipment and munitions for small arms and field cannons, 60% of the Union's siege, seacoast and naval cannons, iron-clad ships, in addition to forging thousands of tons of iron under government contracts. 118 Confederate prisoners of war were housed at Western Penitentiary in Allegheny City, and West Penn Hospital would become our first Veterans Hospital in 1862. Although Pittsburgh never came under enemy attack during the war, a threatened Confederate invasion resulted in one of the largest public works projects ever attempted in the city, where over 10,000 men labored on a massive system of 37 fortification sites built along the hilltops of the city.

**REMEMBER ME: LETTERS HOME FROM A HOSPITAL STEWARD DURING THE CIVIL WAR, 1862-1864, DANIEL MCKINLEY MARTIN**, 2010 by Alan I. West. "One of the most common problems facing diary editors is determining how to arrange the collection of letters into a concise and meaningful format. Alan West has done the best job solving this problem that this reviewer has seen. He successfully creates the proper context in which to study the person as an individual, as well as through his family and profession." (CIVIL WAR NEWS, Jan. 2011 online) Daniel Martin was working as a druggist's clerk in Pittsburgh at the outbreak of the Civil War, and in the spring of 1862 he traveled to Wheeling to join a regiment with friends and neighbors from the Pittsburgh area. Leaving behind his young family, Daniel spent much of the war engaged in actions throughout West Virginia. Two hundred, thirty of his letters, his 1863 diary and a number of his possessions have survived. Daniel's voice provides original and important material on nineteenth century diseases, injuries and death, medicine, and the fight to control the rugged and independently-minded western Virginia. There have been numerous collections of letters published about the Civil War, but few from hospital stewards. Accompanied by well-researched descriptions of diseases, medical theories, the roles of hospital stewards, and the political and social venue of southwestern Pennsylvania, the reader is able to view these letters in the context within which they were written.
